Grade Level (Req.): 6th-8th grade	Content Area (Req.): World Geography, Human Geography, Physical Geography, English	Unit (Opt.):
<p>Connections to Other Disciplines (Opt.):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Science – The analysis somewhat follows the scientific method. Time Frame (Req.): One class period	Goal (Req.): Students will gain understanding about India visually.	
	Objective (Req.): Students will examine and analyze photographs from India. Students will hypothesize about photographs from India. Students will make conclusions about geographical location or culture in India.

<p>Anticipatory Set/Introduction [Inquiry Question is required] (Req.): What can photographs tell us about geography and culture?</p>		
<p>Instructional Sequence/Procedure (Req.):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Put students into pairs and give each pair a photograph of people and places of India. 2. Allow students time to study their photograph. 3. Pass out copies of the Photo Analysis handout. Give students about twenty minutes to observe, study, and analyze their photograph. 4. Have each pair present their findings to the class and show their photograph to the group. The teacher should answer perspectives questions, if possible. 5.
