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Rural Poverty in the U.S.

For your next project you will be creating a presentation about rural poverty in the United States. Before doing this, you and a partner will research which areas of the country have profound rural poverty and why. You will then choose one state to focus on, and research how rural poverty is affecting that state.

Poverty can be seen on every corner of the globe, including here in the United States. Especially in rural areas, the issue of poverty tends to get overlooked because of seclusion, lack of resources, and lower populations. It is your job to shed some light on this important issue facing America today.

Task

Your task will be to create a presentation about rural poverty in the United States. You will be assigned a partner and the two of you will research the following:

- -what areas of the country have profound rural poverty
- -why those areas have rural poverty
- -how rural poverty is affecting a specific state

Rural poverty occurs in almost every state, so every group in the class is expected to present over a different one. Keep a look out for states with especially high or low rural poverty statistics. Some states are better than others, so if you choose a state with low rural poverty levels, explain why that is the case. You may use PowerPoint or Prezi for your presentation.





Process

In order to complete your task, you will need to follow a series of steps.

Collaborative Process:

- 1.) You will be assigned a partner.
- 2.) You and your partner will research which areas of the U.S. have profound rural poverty and why.
- 3.) You will then choose one state and research how rural poverty affects it.
- 4.) Your research should answer the following questions:
 - -Does the state have high or low rural poverty rates?
 - -Why is there or is there not significant rural poverty?
 - -If high rural poverty exists, what efforts have been taken to improve the rural poverty situation? (if any)
- 5.) Be sure to cite your sources.
- 6.) Based off of your research, you and your partner will create a 3-5 minute presentation using PowerPoint or Prezi about rural poverty in both the U.S. as a whole and your chosen state.
- 7.) You and your partner will present to the class.



The U.S. poverty rate rose 2.4 points from '07 to '10, from 12.9% to 15.3%


Large Increase, from 4.1 to 21.9 points -- 249 rural counties

Above average increase, 2.5 to 4 points -- 383 counties

Below average increase, 0.1 to 2.4 points -- 907 counties

Poverty rates steady or declining -- 497 counties

Prosperous -- fewer than 10% in poverty

Below Average -- from 10.1% to 14.4% in poverty

Above Average -- from 14.5% to 20% in poverty

Poor -- from 20.1% to 62% in poverty
